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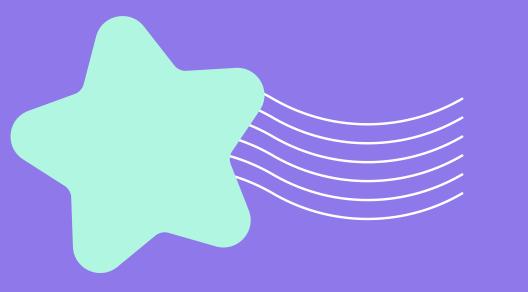

Our History

The Fundación Hospital Pediátrico was established in 2014 with the purpose of providing support to the Dr. Antonio Ortiz University Pediatric Hospital at Centro Médico (HOPU), Puerto Rico's main institution dedicated to the health of children and young people. Driven by the vision and commitment of a group of visionary doctors led by pediatricians; Dr. Alicia Fernández-Sein Pediatric Intensivist, former Director of the Pediatric Hospital Intensive Care Unit and Dr. Liliana Morales, MD, Mph Director of the Emergency Room of the Pediatric Hospital together with dedicated volunteers, the Foundation has evolved to become a fundamental pillar within the hospital community.

In these 11 years, we have worked tirelessly since the first event, 5K, organized and successfully executed by Dr. Fernández Sein and Dr. Morales who was a Resident at the time. This event marked the beginning of a union between doctors of the Pediatric Hospital and the team of the Fundación Hospital Pediátrico that continues to develop and grow by leaps and bounds in favor of the health service of the third millennium to improve the quality of life of HOPU patients, both those who are hospitalized and those who receive outpatient care. Our work is focused on providing the best possible care through pioneering programs and unique services tailored to our community, optimizing the hospital experience and supporting both children and their families at critical times.

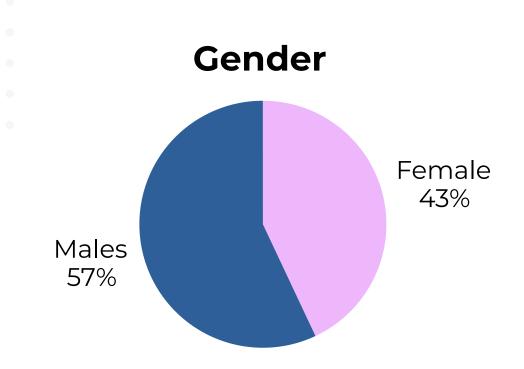

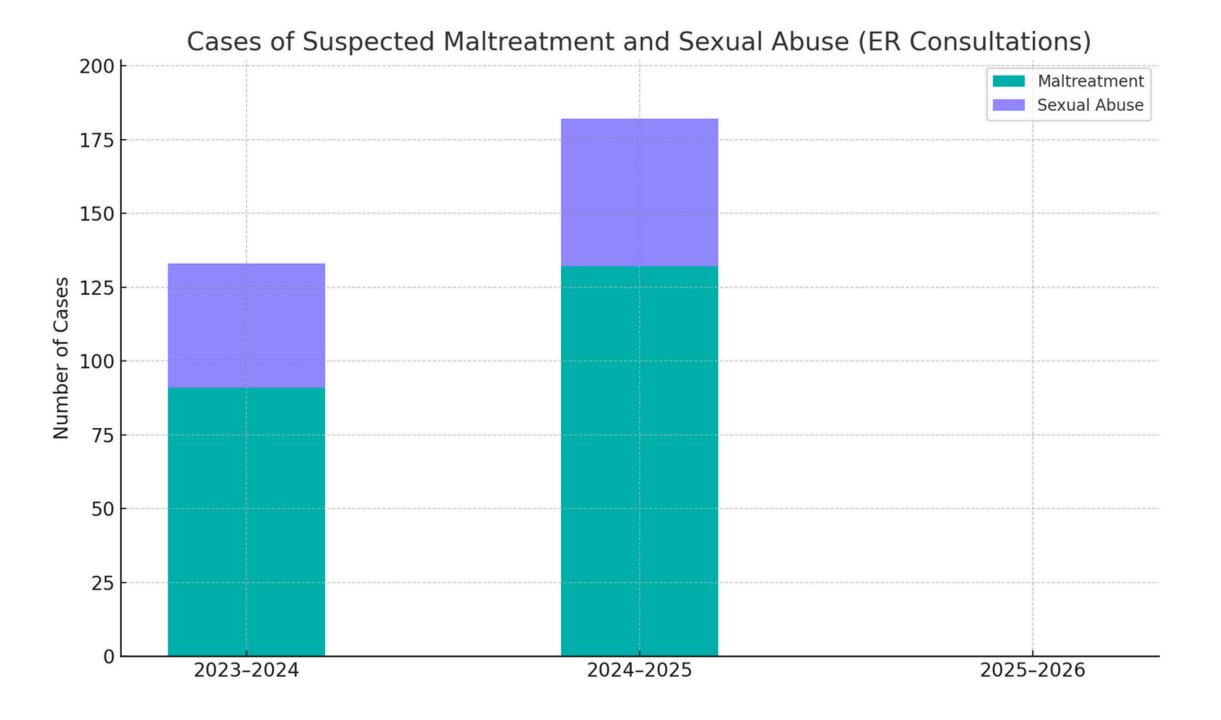

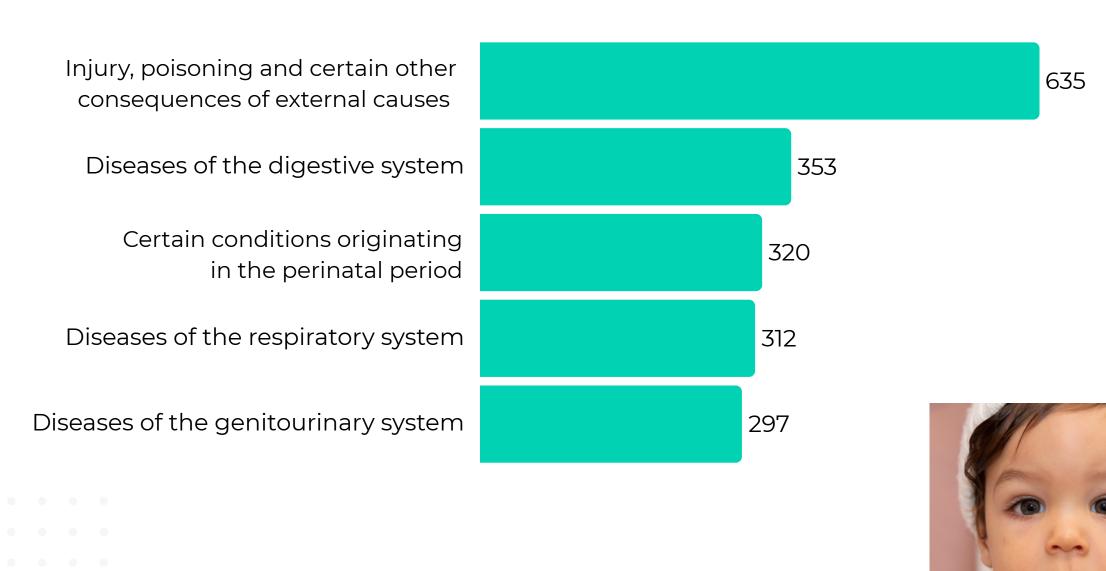


Top Diagnoses



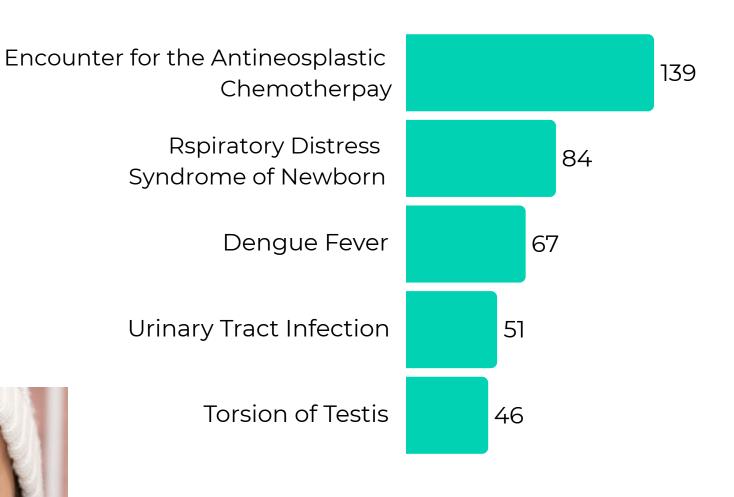
Top 5 ICD-10 Diagnostic Categories

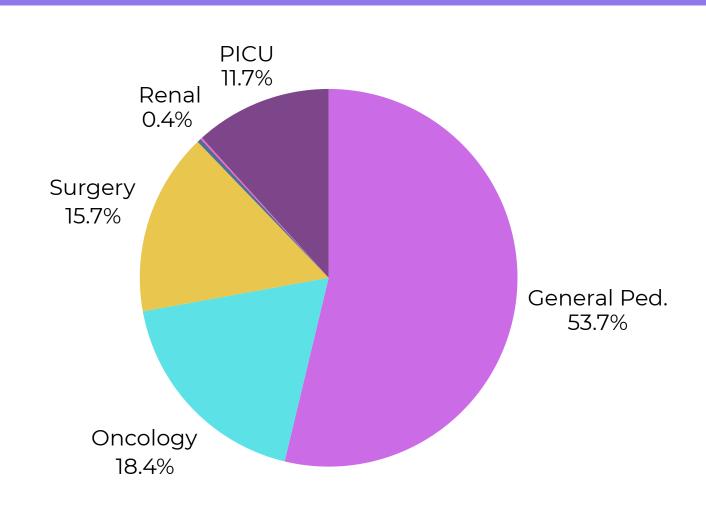
Emotional Support Child Life

2024-25 / \$200K

The Child Life program plays a critical role in the mental health of pediatric patients and their families, providing emotional and psychological support in times of great vulnerability, such as hospitalization. Child Life Specialists are health care professionals trained to guide children and their caregivers through the challenges of a new diagnosis, chronic illness, or medical procedures.

Through interventions such as medical play, preparation for medical procedures, and emotion management strategies, we help reduce anxiety and fear.

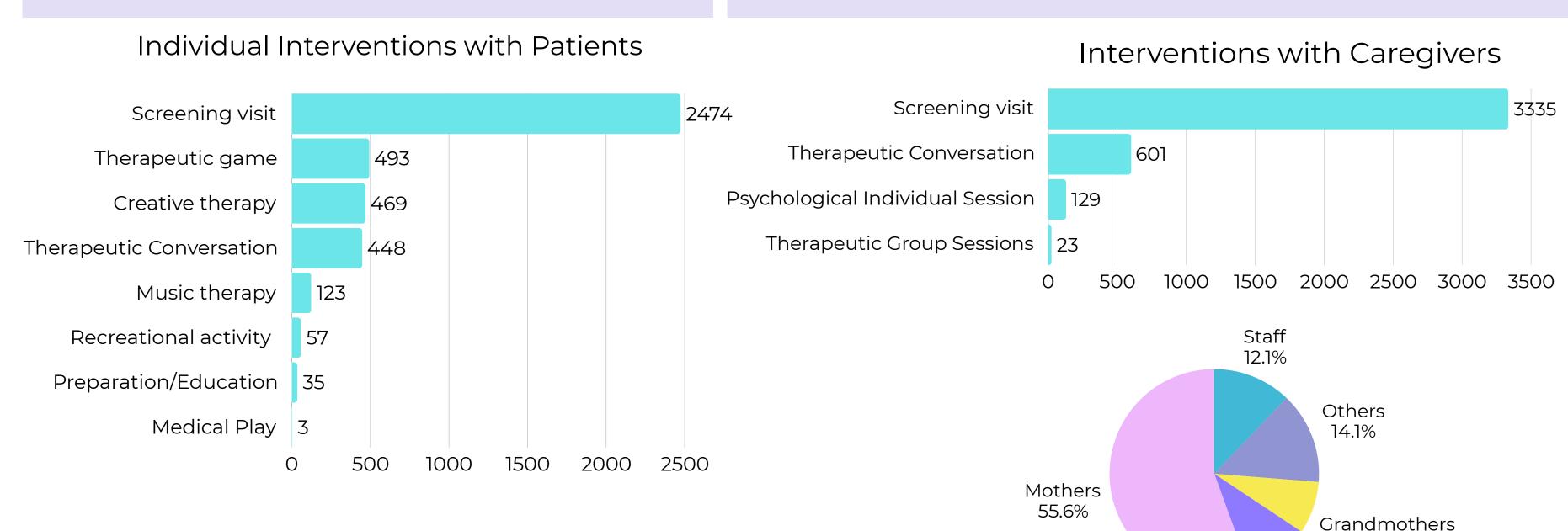

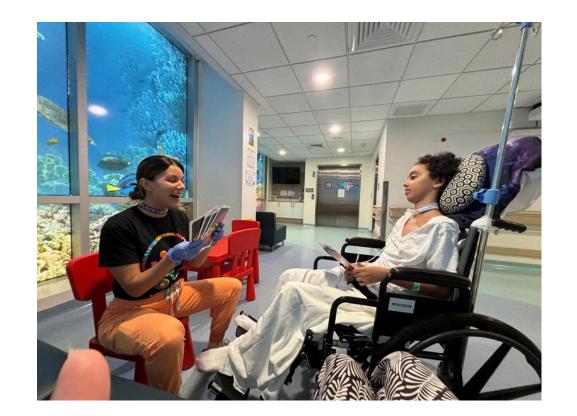


Physical Therapy

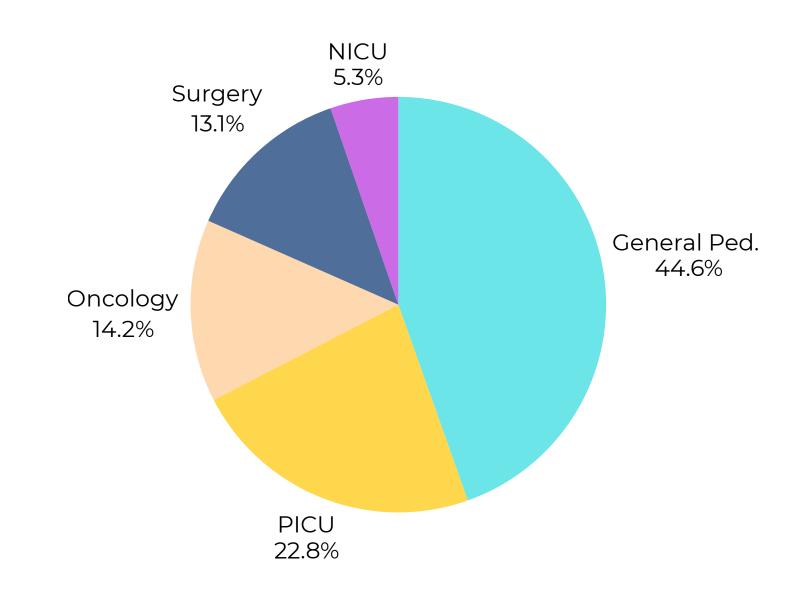

We offer physical therapy services for patients, birth to age 21, who are receiving medical care in the hospital setting. Our team of doctors, specialists in Physical Therapy, works collaboratively with the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, focusing on pediatric needs. Our goal is to promote independence, optimize functional mobility, and support the ongoing rehabilitation process.

In addition to addressing the physical aspect, our physical therapy in a pediatric setting also contributes to children's emotional well-being, giving them a sense of accomplishment, independence, and self-confidence.

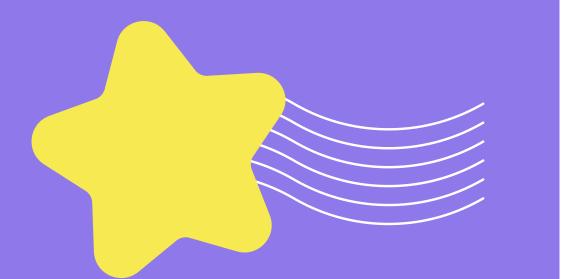

Care Coordination





2024-25 / \$100K

The Care Coordination Program is designed to provide comprehensive, personalized support to pediatric patients with chronic conditions such as chronic kidney disease (CKD), end-stage renal disease (ESRD), and pediatric patients awaiting transplant.

PACMA (Bridge to Adult Medical Care) is an ongoing initiative created by the Fundación Hospital Pediátrico to support pediatric patients in their transition to adult medical care. This program follows the guidelines of the "GOT Transition" program, being a federal initiative created by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). PACMA is designed to ensure a smooth and effective transition for those who have received pediatric care and must now transition to adult health care.

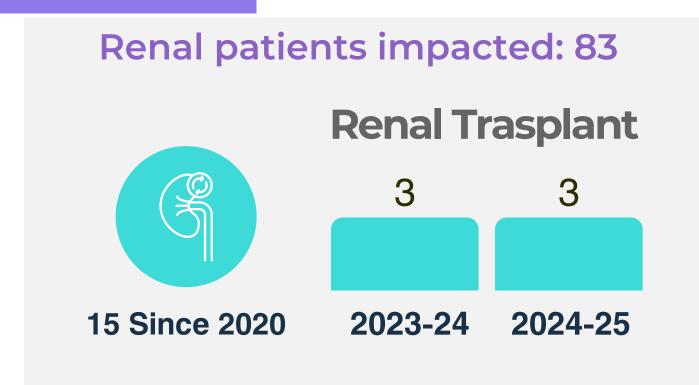
We coordinate telemedicine services enabling hospitalists to conduct 1-2 virtual follow-up visits with selected patients within one week of discharge, ensuring seamless care transitions and improved post-hospital recovery monitoring.

We provide a helping hand and a welcoming refuge in the most difficult times during the hospital stay. We are motivated to offer comprehensive, free and accessible support to all patients and their families during hospitalization based on the availability of funds. Our goal is to be a constant source of support and comfort, providing a more bearable and human experience in the midst of adversity. The Patient and Family Help Center not only provides direct assistance to those in need, but also supports staff and residents, creating a more collaborative and empathetic environment at the Hospital.

A&E Design, Equipment, & Setting of the Renal Dialysis Unit - \$400K+

This project is a collaboration between our organization and the Puerto Rico Department of Health (\$3M), aimed at providing critical care to young patients. For the completion of the project, we will provide modern furniture/equipment with a playroom area, and the creation of a Pediatric-friendly environment.

Opening planned Fall 2025

Humanizing healthcare service spaces for pediatric patients - \$100K

This project seeks to transform the hospital environment into spaces that promote comfort and safety for children. With the right setting, we reduce stress and the anxiety of our little patients, helping to improve their recovery and communication with their caregivers and medical staff. By integrating elements of play and distraction, we create an environment where children can maintain a positive mood, while parents feel more involved in their health journey.

Family Center \$400K

With the aim of improving our facilities, this project seeks to create a more welcoming space for families to receive support during hospitalization. In addition to providing basic supplies, food and coordination of external assistance, the renovated center will provide specialized psychosocial services and recreational activities for children and their families. We want this Center to be a comprehensive care haven, helping families face the challenges of hospitalization with greater strength and serenity.

Opening planned Spring 2026

Laundromat - \$300K

There is a pressing need for a laundry service that helps parents and caregivers of patients keep their clothes clean during long hospitalizations. It is for this reason that we are developing a project to build a free laundry room inside the hospital, providing families with the convenience of carrying out their work at no additional cost. The average stay of a patient is eight days, however there are cases in which hospitalizations extend for weeks or months.

- Through our new partnership with the Food Bank, we now distribute 4,000 pounds of donated food each month to caregivers, providing essential nutritional support to families in need.

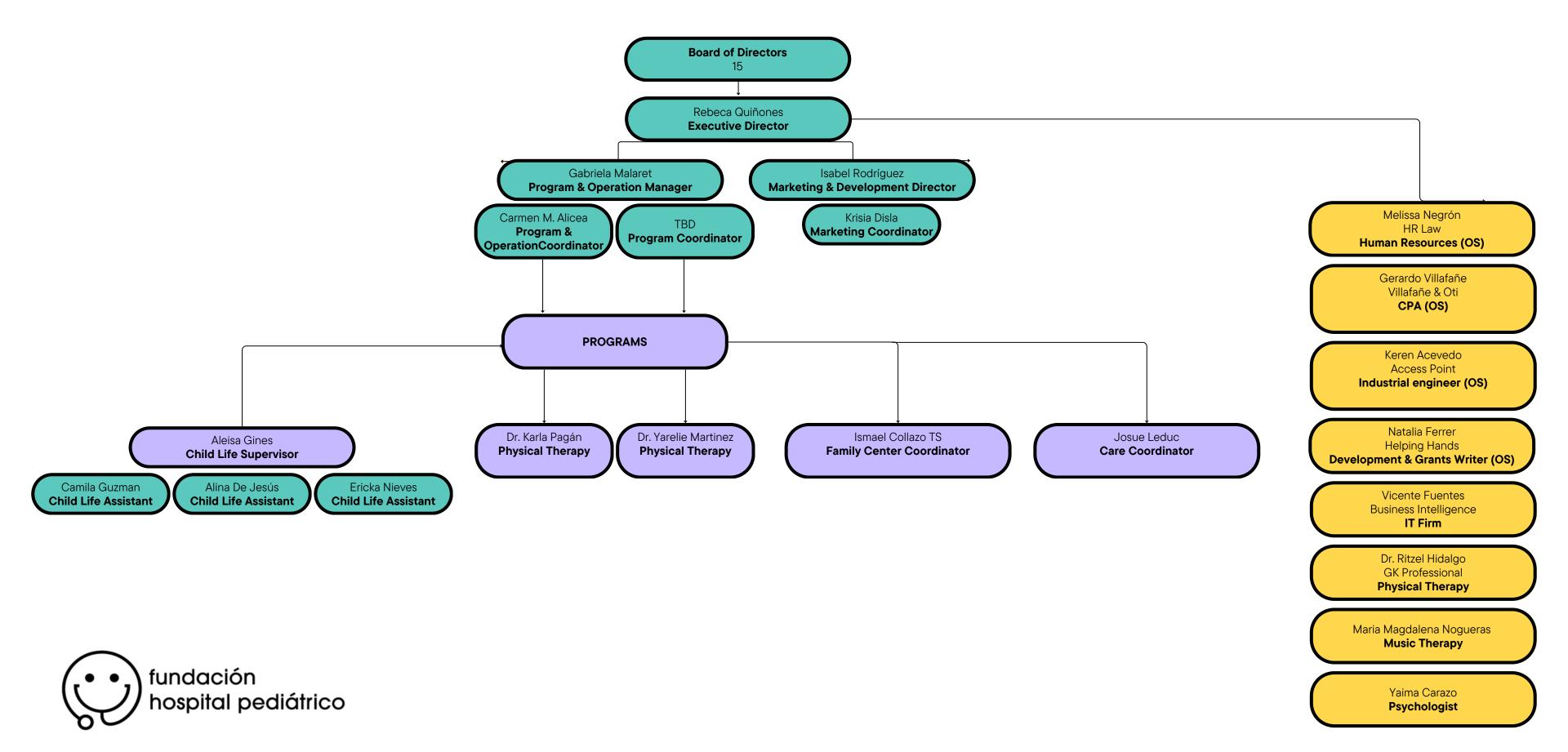

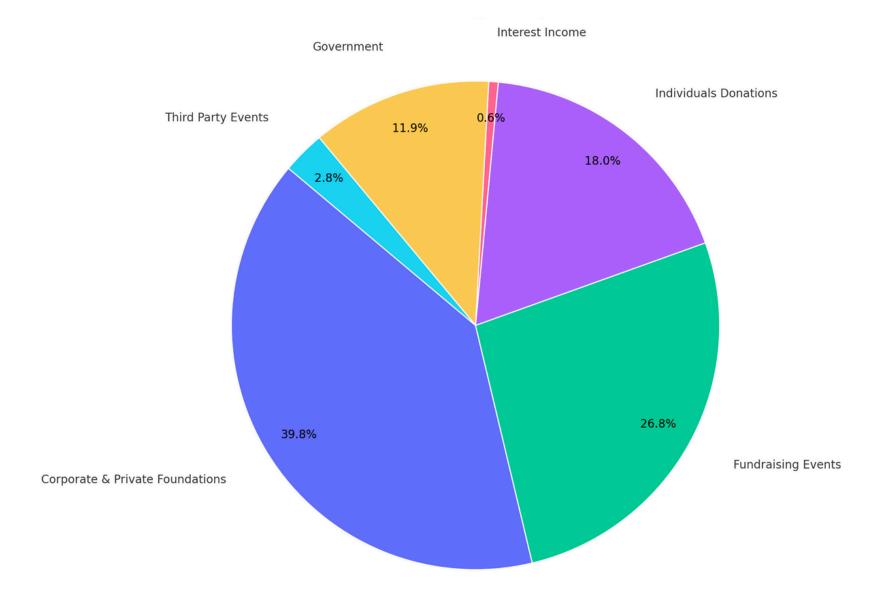

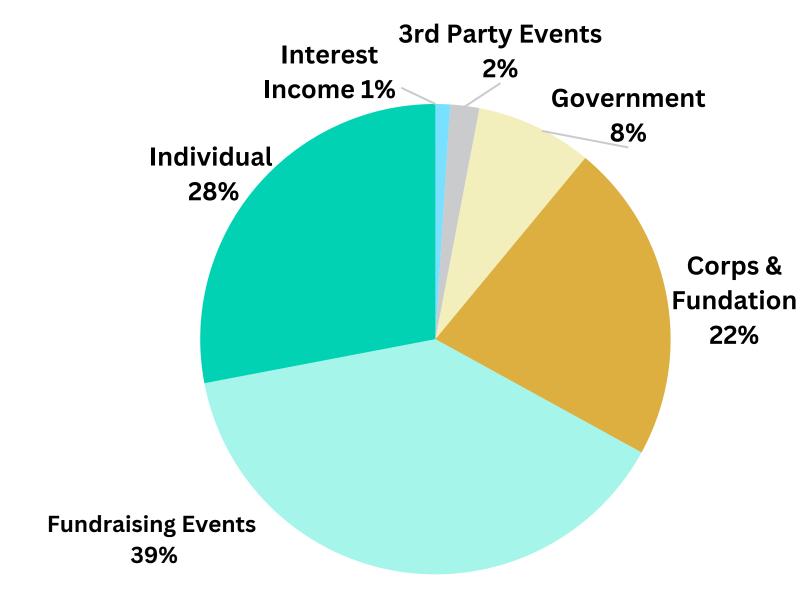


Where are funds come from...

Total: \$1,133,684



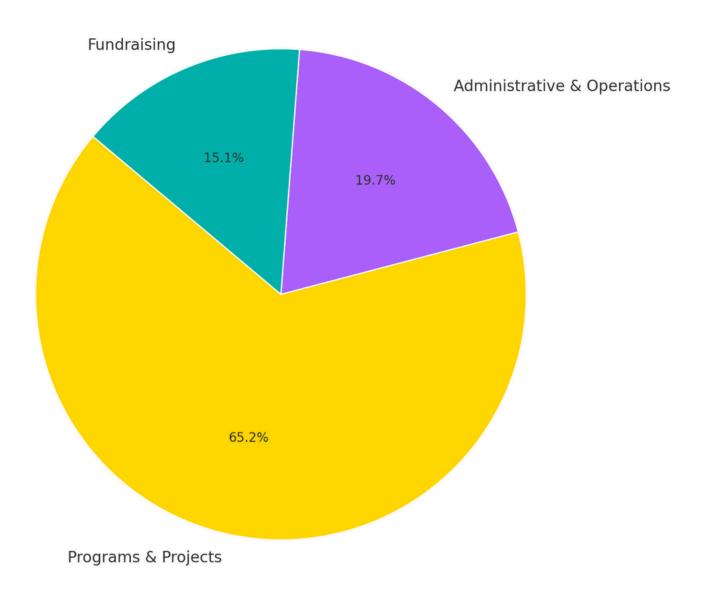
Comparison observations

- Corporate & Private Foundations became the dominant revenue source in 2024–2025, nearly doubling its previous share.
- Fundraising Events remained strong but decreased in relative contribution.
- Government funding saw a notable increase in both dollar amount and percentage.
- Individual giving decreased as a percentage of total revenue.
- Total income grew significantly year-over-year, mainly due to the rise in foundation and government support.

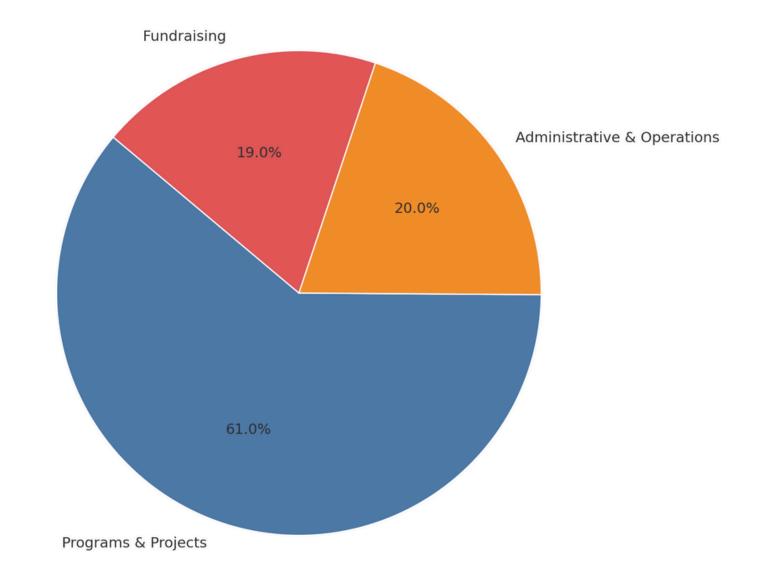


Strategy and Financial Needs

Child Life Program (emotional support)

Our first-of-a-kind program in Puerto Rico, dedicated to emotional and psychological support, continues to grow, achieving:

Thanks to funds raised and generous donations from Power Sports, Power Solar, and Olein Corp., totaling \$400,000, we have contributed to structural design, pediatric-friendly décor, the creation of a playroom, and the acquisition of furniture and additional equipment for this vital unit.
